amendment offered, that's one thing. If you want it, that's another thing. And if you want it, I think you ought to stand up and say so. If you don't want it, you ought to stand up and say the same thing. I'm trying to help the greatest industry this state has and I'm only getting milk warm enthusiasm. And I think it's a rather commentary on the state in which the bulk of the prosperity depends upon the area of livestock. Now, if you don't want it, say so. You'll draw no blood from me. I don't have any cattle, I only eat them. I'm not concerned whether they're stolen or whether...how they get on my table. So I move for the adoption of the amendment and ask for a Roll Call vote.

PRESIDENT: What's the purpose of your rising, Senator Schmit? Now, wait, he was closing on his amendment. I won't allow you to make any speech.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Senator Syas, I just got tired of sitting. I was standing up here and I'm just answering your question, that's all.

PRESIDENT: All right. The same....all right. We're going to take a vote. A Roll Call vote on Senator Carpenter's amendment.....

Take the Roll.

CLERK: Took Roll Call vote. 36 ayes, 3 nays, remainder not voting.

PRESIDENT: The amendment's adopted.

CLERK: Okay, Mr. President, the next amendment is a.... the one I have on page 26, etc. Read corrections on first Carpenter amendment. Is that the one you want to take next, Senator Carpenter?

PRESIDENT: Is that the one for women's committee?

CLERK: It doesn't say on the amendment, it just says on page 26, lines 9, 10, 13 and 14.

SENATOR CARPENTER: This amendment is on the department which has the commission on the status of women. The Governor in the past and it still exists, has appointed a committee of about 41 women, no men, in which those within the commission and those outside of the commission, and they don't always agree, but it's my understanding in this particular thing, they do. And the amount of money is small. And the purpose of the money is to employ a fulltime director in order to direct the commission and to inform its membership as to the problems that confront the responsibilities of the commission. I would presume that some of the members of this Body have been contacted by those who are here to lobby for this particular amendment. I move for the adoption of the amendment, \$10,000 as I recall.

PRESIDENT: It's been moved and seconded to adopt the amendment. No one's asked to talk so we'll take a vote. Clerk, clerk, do you just need a simple majority. Have you all voted. If you have, we'll tabulate the vote.
