PRESIDENT: Maybe the Chair should remind you just once again that Senator Snyder is trying to return 629 to Select File for specific amendment. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, Mr. President, on the motion to return.

PRESIDENT: Very good, the bill is returned.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, I would move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is there need for further discussion of the specific amendment that Senator Snyder has offered? Any need for further discussion? Then the question is shall the amendment be adopted. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed will vote no. You are adopting Senator Snyder's motion, amendment to 629 on Select File. When you get around to it, he needs 25 votes. Senator Goodrich for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Is this a vote on the amendment itself?

PRESIDENT: That is correct sir.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Would somebody tell us what the amendment is.

PRESIDENT: Very good, Senator Snyder, do you want to repeat what the amendment is?

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, Senator Goodrich the bill is 629, it is Senator Keyes bill and the committee amendment as reported out did not include the words "or county" where there is not a municipality which has a comprehensive plan or planning board. It is a corrective amendment and it was intended to have been there and the other part is that the renumbering of the original sections was incorrect as reported out and it goes from 1-5 and it should be 2-6. Lb629.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays Mr. President, on the motion to adopt.

PRESIDENT: Very good, the amendment is adopted. Now,

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, I would move that LB629 as amended be advanced to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion to readvance LB629 as amended. All those in favor of readvancing the bill say aye, those opposed say no. So, thank you. The bill is advanced. Now do you have other motions on the desk? Alright, Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I move that the remainder of the afternoon we spend on non-controversial bills and just start where the Clerk I believe that it is after about the 1st 8 or 9 bills that they begin to be non-controversial and if anybody objects to a bill it is up before us they make an objection we just skip on to the next bill.

PRESIDENT: Now, the Chair understands that this is a departure from what was at least scheduled or what would have projected Senator Mahoney and I understand that 997 was up for discussion
