Alright do you all understand the motion? The motion does change the order of business. The Chair is going to rule that that will take 25 votes to bind the body to that particular action. Is there need for discussion of Senator Mahoney's motion? Are you ready for the vote? The question is if you support the concept that we go tonon-controversial bills for the rest of the afternoon vote aye, if not vote no. Thank you. Senator Richendifer voting aye. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney do you recommend that we start around 711 or something like that?

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, if there are any bills that are prior to 711 and any Senator feels that they are non-controversial they should let their voices speak now. It is the opinion of the Clerk that down through about 677 there could be some controversial bills in the first six or eight or ten. If there is any before 711 you just speak now and we can take that first.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh, do you see something that is non-controversial that you want to take up. We are starting on 711 on General File here if you want to look at your worksheet. If there is anything that falls ahead of that that you think is non-controversial we would be willing to test the water. Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, we did try 622 about 2 or 3 weeks ago, it had to do with the Fire Marshall's office and the objections that were on it are to be eliminated with amendments from the Governor's office so that we can compromise on this bill and I don't know of anyone right now that is objecting to it, if they are I wish that they would stand up. 622.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Senator Skarda isn't here this afternoon and those amendments were acceptable to him, and I haven't heard anything different so....

SENATOR BARNETT: They ~~are~~ supposed to be on the way down right now so if you want we could maybe go over it and come back to it a little later.

PRESIDENT: Fine, we wouldn't object to coming back, and you made your point and that is good enough. Jump up a little bit later and we will take it. Lets begin the General File debate here of LB711, if it hasn't been read, the Clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Read amendment for 711.
