I mentioned in jest to Senator Cavanaugh this morning. A compromise on the liquor issue or the alcohol issue on campus and say alcohol, might can be joined to the streaking issue, because there are some students who want to catch these individuals and use pellet guns on them, belts and other things. I don't know what their motive would be. But if the alcohol to be utilized is rubbing alcohol, to sooth the injuries that might occur to these kind of people, that is the way to have alcohol on campus and let the children indulge their activites as they choose. I just had to tell the Legislature, and if the rest of you get these calls, if some of these people are from your districts, tell them I have enough to be concerned about, and I'd prefer that they don't call me about these things. Find some other way to handle it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. Chairman. A point of personal privilege. A think on the same point that Senator Chambers is talking about. I think that, I think Senator Chambers, I understood him to say this took place on campus. If it took place on campus, the University of Nebraska has it's own police department and therefore the Lincoln Rice Department cannot act in that case. And I think possibly at this time the University Police Department is standing by waiting for directions from the administration, and from the B oard of Regents, which I doubt if they are doing anything.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Maresh, asks us to return to LB897.

PRESIDENT: Senator Maresh. We are not talking on LB897. We passed over 897 a minute ago.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, I spoke to Senator Warner, and Senator Stull, also have interests in this bill. I believe they have amendments to the committee amendment, so I'll let them speak on their amendments now.

PRESIDENT: Who is handling the amendments. Senator Warner are you handling the amendments?

CLERK: Well no, Mr. President, the committee amendments have been adopted, and Senator Maresh has offered a computer print-out, which is in the bill book as an amendment. That is pending. And now Senator Warner is offering an amendment to the computer printout amendment.

SENATOR MARESH: I believe they're speaking to the bill itself though. That's provisions in the bill, we'd better hold that up until we adopt the amendment, the General File amendments that I spoke on awhile ago. Because these are what they took out of the bill itself. About the refunds and process of Lt. Governor and Governor. Oh, it is. O.K.
