CLERK: 28 ayes, 13 nays to return.

PRESIDENT: Very good, then the bill is returned. We will move on to Final Reading then of LB641. Before we get into that, while we are getting ready for that Final READING the Chair would like the privilege of introducing Mr. Fellman and their three children. They are under the south balcony, and this is their first visit to the Legislature this morning and we'd like to have you stand out if you would please Mr. Fellman and the children we'd like to welcome you to Lincoln and to the unicameral Legislature where you husband labors here. Very good, thank you. Additionally we have seated in the south balcony this morning from Senator Barnett's district we have 41 first grade students from Kahoa School here in Lincoln, their instructors, Mrs. Doane and Mrs. Holgren, and we have several mothers along here to keep order I think, We have Mrs. Watkins, Mrs. Newbering, Mrs. Cook, and Miss Stickney, the student teacher is up there. We are delighted to have you here this morning to visit the Nebraska Unicameral Legislature. Thank you for coming. It beats going to school doesn't it? All right, very good. Attention please, Final Reading of LB641

CLERK: LB 641 read.

PRESIDENT: Stand by, my indicator says 39.

CLERK: I have 38, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Stand by for just a moment before you clear the board. All right the bill is passed with the Emergency Clause attached. Attention please, the Final Reading of LB694. The Clerk will read the bill. Senator Carpenter for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I'd like to suggest that the Clerk read low and rapidly, and that the members be not confined to their seats, but remain in the chamber.

PRESIDENT: All right, are there objections to the motion? Hearing not. Then it's..hearing no objections then, if is so ordered. The Chair would like to ask however that you do remain in the chamber, and that if you do leave the chamber would you kindly clear with the chair so that we can know where everyone is at. There is a constitutional requirement that this be obliged. Thank you. The Clerk will read Final Reading of LB694.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.
