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efficiency and reappropriation bill.

SENATOR PROUD: Well, Senator, I think in my judgment...of course, those bills take priority....I think the rules so provide that we do.

SENATOR CLARK: Right.

SENATOR PROUD: And so I....I....the things we....the things we absolutely have to do, this isn't going to prevent us from doing them.

SENATOR CLARK: But I would think that rather than saying we have 18 days, we might say we have 13 days left.

SENATOR PROUD: Well, that all depends whether or not we want to adjourn and things like that but you might be absolutely correct. One thing we all know, we've got a lot more to do than we can accomplish.

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark, are you through? Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I'd like to suggest to the Speaker that he put on the board in a column by themselves the bills selected by each member of the Legislature, one bill. That every morning when we meet, we start after Final Reading, after Select File, discussing those bills in those or that order. In the afternoon, we devote ourselves to General File, after excluding this list. We start at the top and we continue and if anybody wants a bill passed over, we pass it over. The second day we start on General File where we left off and so on and so forth. Now, and also that we meet at 1:30 every afternoon, not 2:00 o'clock. So I move if the Speaker has no objection, that number one, he make his list after the members put it on the Clerk's desk and you must do that before we adjourn today. Those bills we put on a separate column on General File and when we start tomorrow morning, we start on those bills and continue through then. In the afternoon, at 1:30, when we meet every day at 1:30, we start on General File with the exclusion of this list of bills and we work out General File and with the objection of any one senator, we pass a bill over. We go to the next one and the following day we start on General File where we left off. I think that gives everybody something. I move the adoption.

PRESIDENT: Well, we have a motion now before....Senator Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: I have no objection to that. I'll be frank with you, I don't know whether it will work because sometimes we're so slow getting to General File but then I have no objection trying something new down here once in a while and if it doesn't work, then we can try something else.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I think the rules would call for the Speaker to be able to set the order of the bills and I don't believe there's any particular necessity of having a motion unless you so desire to have so. If he desires to, the Speaker can set the order of the bills.

PRESIDENT: All right,.....Senator Carpenter.....
