SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, fellow members, first of all I want to qualify myself that the last time I think that we talked about this one of my chief interests is Nebraska's water and I think for all of us, but, this million dollars is like fighting an elephant with a fly swatter. I'm a republican but I'm certainly against the kind of program that we have got coming out of Washington. We practically have no soil conservation at all anymore. They have taken out all of our terracing and that is for terracing and many other soil or water conserving projects. I would like to see this million dollars, I would like to see it ear marked. So it will do some real good. I went to a meeting of the Natural Resource District out in Norfolk and they were more interested in picking up cans along the road and consolidating counties and everything but soil conservation. I went to a meeting about a year ago in Broken Bow and they had irrigation about the seventh priority and they had recreation at the top. I asked them why and they said, well we have plenty of food so we are going into irrigation. I think that this money could be feddered away with more bureaucracy and I'm going to vote for it but I want it ear marked so that we get some real projects going. As far as us trying to finance, the state of Nebraska trying to finance terracing our...why half of the county could use this million dollars. Were in an area that is hilly and it just won't do anything. What we need is a change in congress to bring this money back from the federal government to do what we have been doing the past 30-40 years.
