But I don't see that it is going to serve any good. If you didn't understand it this morning, I don't think you are going to understand it now.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly do you care to respond? We are still on LB 677.

SENATOR KELLY: Well, there may have been those in the membership this morning that did not realize that this bill had a thorough going over by the Government Committee, and that it's had a complete airing both in the news media and by the members of this body under the flag of 677. And it's been my purpose to contact everybody that has had objections to the original version as it came out of the bill drafter's office, and to extensively amend the bill that puts it in the form of Senator Carpenter's amendment to 877. Now that bill may become contraversial. But I'm sure that 677 gives us the procedure of disclosure that we want.

SENATOR CARPENTER: All right, let him take it up. I have no objections. I'll get out of his way, temporarily.

PRESIDENT: Clerk will read the title.
All right, we have amendments to the bill. Senator Kelly. Under the rules, Senator Kelly you have the right to explain your bill before we take up any of the amendments here.

CLERK: There are amendments offered by Senator Kelly that would probably be first considered.

PRESIDENT: All right, Do you want to. Title has been read.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President the amendments that were suggested by the Government Military Affairs Committee were contained in my amendments. And they are extensive.

CLERK: They are set out in full on page 744 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR KELLY: 744.

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR KELLY: The amendments can best be explained, by a.... explaining the bill in it's entirety. And acceptance of the amendments will do what I will be explaining.
