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because people want their money in advance. They have dealt with politicians quite awhile. But sometimes there are little piddling expenses like, I can just think of my own case right now, like picking up helium for some ballons sometimes. You don't happen to have your campaign treasurer with you, and it amounts to just a few dollars, and you've got to pick it up right then. Now you can either pay it out of your own pocket, or pay it out of your own checking account, but sometime you need that flexibility. Not that I'm trying to say that you shouldn't run everything through one account. It's just the idea that sometimes those little things that come up. You've got to pay for it right then to get it and you can't find your campaign treasurer. And so I think your candidates should be..have a personal checking account, myself, and if you want to make a personal account open to the public, that's fine with me. I know mine certainly is.

SENATOR KELLY: Usually the signature cards for checking accounts and banks have places for quite a few signatures and there is no limit on the number of signature cards you can use for any account, and it certainly would become the practice where there would be many people that would have access to writing checks out of those accounts.

PRESIDENT: Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Senator Kelly, now I'm not sure exactly sure that the State law, because we are changing it now. The Federal Law is that just your treasurer can sign those checks. No one else, just the one person.

SENATOR KELLY: This is not the case in state law. And it's not the thrust of this bill to tie this down to one signature. The thrust of this bill is to have all money go through this one ledger sheet, so that it audit trail is very plain and very simple. And there would be nothing wrong with carrying checks. The candidate or any of his workers to fill out the checks instead of using the \$1.50 or \$2.00.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh, did you want to be heard on the Kelly amendment here to 677.

SENATOR MARSH: Yes, I have a question for Senator Kelly. As I understand it, if the candidate bought helium out of his own pocket, there would be nothing that would say he could not present this bill to his treasurer if he wants only one person signing his checks. And have a refund for the amount of the cash he spent for the small purchase of helium. Right.

SENATOR KELLY; This would certainly be acceptable. Yes, mam.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the Kelly amendments. Senator Fellman.

SENATOR FELLMAN: I thought all expenditures have to come through one fund.

SENATOR KELLY: That is correct.
