SENATOR FELLMAN: Now let me do to you what you did to me yesterday. I don't want to do that, and I want to set up and have a dozen different people spending money for me. What's to stop me.

SENATOR KELLY: All you should do under this system would be to have them have signature cards at the bank, and give them checks.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Then what's been accomplished?

SENATOR KELLY: All of the Money that they spend will all come back through that one ledger sheet.

SENATOR FELLMAN: But it doesn't have to.

SENATOR KELLY: It will have to come through that one bank account. You could have a committee in Scottsbluff, and Gering and Omaha and timbuckto, but those checks would all clear through that one bank account.

SENATOR FELLMAN: What happens if they don't do it?

SENATOR KELLY: Well, they would because they could only have that one bank account.

SENATOR FELLMAN: What's the penalty?

SENATOR KELLY: \$100 for everytime it doesn't.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Then what?

SENATOR KELLY: That's it.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Is that serious enough? I create a \$10,000 fraud and I get penalized \$100.

SENATOR KELLY: That's correct.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Well, what good will that do?

SENATOR KELLY: Fraud will certainly be known by the voters before the election time.

SENATOR FELLMAN: You mean you are going to get a trial and conviction all before the election? It's reportable three or four weeks before the deadline and you are going to get a trial you are going to charge me, and have a trial and a conviction all before the deadline?

SENATOR KELLY: I don't know that I'm going to.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Is your County Attorney in Hall County can.

SENATOR KELLY: Could be.

PRESIDENT: Are you all through discussing the Kelly amendment? To make sure the Chair understands. This the first amendment that is offered here, and it is the one found on page 744. Senator Kelly is that right.
