SENATOR STULL: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature. There are three bills up there that's been bracketed for some two weeks for Monday.

PRESIDENT: The Chair is aware of that likewise. Senator Richard Lewis for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR LEWIS: I'd just like to comment on Senator Nore's statement, if I might. On this bracketing, I too favor bracketing if that's the wishes of this group. But I don't..I resent a little bit his remark that we must have peace, peace at any price. I think that the rate papers, think a little bit too much for peace here, and I would object to his peace at any price.

PRESIDENT: The Chair has a difficult position here, because we really have a question of printing the amendment, I don't think there is much of a problem there, and Senator Duis' motion is to bracket the bill until Monday. But Senator Duis...Senator Goodrich threw in another hooker on that one, and that is to place it ahead of General File, which would place it ahead of the three bills already bracketed that have been up there. I'm not going to accept that motion.

SENATOR DUIS: I will not accept that unless he can get it on as amendment to my motion. Because I don't like hookers..I guess.

PRESIDENT: That was a poor choice of words. Sorry.

SENATOR DUIS: What I'm trying to tell the Chair if I might is that I think we should conduct our business Monday in it's regular form as we do, and this when it's bracketed will come up in it's proper order Monday. If we don't even get to it, Monday we won't get to it until Tuesday. But it would be over in the bracket right below everything -else that is bracketed for Monday. And our regular business would take affect. Now Senator Goodrich, would want to try and amend that motion. He certainly can, but I don't want the hooker in there.

PRESIDENT: Very good, Senator Goodrich that's the way we are going to leave it. If you want to amend where it goes to General File ahead of those three bills bracketed for Monday you will have to move that way. Other than that this motion would leave that this bill number 4 to be debated. It's the Chairs understanding that it would be number four to be debated and be debated Monday. What is your pleasure.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Is that after 932 and 933 and 785.

PRESIDENT: That's the Chairs understanding.

SENATOR GOODRICH: It would be bracketed in there for Monday morning or for Monday. Whenever we get to it Monday.

PRESIDENT: Yes.

SENATOR GOODRICH: All right.

PRESIDENT: All right. Then the question is do you want to print the amendments and bracket the bill until Monday, to be heard after those three bills all ready scheduled. If you are in favor of the motion vote aye, if not vote no. The Chair would rule that it takes 25 votes to bind the body to this action.
