SENATOR RICHARD LEWIS: I suspect that you could interpret it that way.

SENATOR BARNETT: Well that's what I'm really trying to find out, if you are going to try to put them in the same area as a master then, we don't need the journeymen etc. If you are trying to separate the two classes.

SENATOR RICHARD LEWIS: This is not my intent, Sir.

SENATOR BARNETT: I would have to support Senator Frank Lewis then, to keep this thing separated. And have to ask him that Frank, I think that's what you wanted. To separate these into classes, I think.

PRESIDENT: Wait a minute. Senator Barnett are you through. O.K. Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR FRANK LEWIS: The thing that is important, and there was an attempt to try to solve everyone's problem in expertise in which they were going to work. Now the bill as we put it together, we thought solved all those problems. Now the thing I think that's occurring is there are people that want to do not want this bill passed, and I think that's a legitimate interest of their's. But instead of trying to mess up the bill as we have tried to put it together. I would suggest, and some people have already suggested that to me, that there will be a move to indefinitely postpone. But if we are not going to let's stay consistent with what we've done in the bill, rather than try to destroy what we try to do with classifications. Because that was thought up very carefully. We looked at some other existing states, that had it, and it was working. We tried to work with the REA, we tried to work with all those concerned. And I told my good friend, Senator Lewis, and Senator Rasmussen who also has an interest that obviously if we could put together a bill that accomplished the objectives that we want it to, there was no point in trying to water it down, and the bill I believe it ought to go or not go. And so I would oppose the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy, did you give up a minute ago. O.K. Wait a minute. Senator Duis is next, and then Senator Nore. Senator Duis. We are debating the first of Senator Richard Lewis' amendment.

SENATOR DUIS: Yes, I think that Senator Richard Lewis, if I might maybe I can help just a second here. We have a small conference going on back here.

PRESIDENT: And one two of them want to speak too, So.

SENATOR DUIS: I tell let me pass now, because when they get through.

PRESIDENT: They are through now, I think you can speak to Senator Richard Lewis.

SENATOR DUIS: Senator Richard Lewis. If I might be able to assist you. I think probably the question that you might have here is between single phase and three phase wiring. Which of course would in some instances be pretty great and in other instances wouldn't amount to a whole lot, depending on the type of motor that or sets that they are hooking up. And consequently are you inquiring as to the classification of the electrician
