

course that our good appropriations committee has sought out in the 1054 which was on your desk at the present time if you will check pages 17 and 18.

PRESIDENT: Speaker Proud.

SPEAKER PROUD: Mr. President, I think that we have about exhausted, is Senator Marvel here?

PRESIDENT: Is Senator Marvel here? Right here.

SPEAKER PROUD: I would like to ask Senator Marvel one question. As I say when I stood up and started asking questions that I do not necessarily oppose the bill. It does appear to me to be vague. However, I think that as far as my record on ADC is concerned you will find that I voted to increase it and something that will alleviate these help these mothers that are put in a difficult position because of circumstances beyond their control. If that will help them, I would like to ask Senator Marvel, since he is the chairman of the budget committee and is putting on a...a..his name on the line for Governor and I'm not trying to embarrass you Senator, I may vote for the bill. In your judgment would this would just this money, would this just apply to mothers on welfare? I mean use the words of the department of welfare and I presume that since that department spends the money it would just apply to mothers on welfare. If you don't have the answer to that question, I can ask Senator Kelly or Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes, may I go on and make a statement on it?

SENATOR PROUD: Yes, I wish that you would.

SENATOR MARVEL: First of all we have the million dollars in the appropriations bill as Senator Duis has already indicated and this ties down that money a little more thoroughly than the appropriations bill does. It states in effect that this money has to be used in this category. I think that I am correct in this Senator Kelly. I think that others have said and I'll repeat, and I think that we have tried as best we can in this appropriations bill in the welfare department to tie down money, Senator Proud so that it does what some say, and that is to break the cycle. The only way you are going to break the cycle, the welfare cycle as far as some are concerned, because a lot of these families have only a mother at the end or the head of them is to give this mother the opportunity to go out and work. The only way that she can really do this is to provide some kind of care for her children. This to me is the understanding of this particular area the million dollars is already in the appropriations bill but 972 as I understand it ties it down more and says in effect that the money must be used in this category and can not be simply permissive.

SENATOR PROUD: In other words, Senator Marvel, regardless of the fact that it says that welfare departments shall do something, the appropriations committee or the legislature in general has the last word on how much money we are going to budget for this purpose. In your judgment this would not open up any kind of vast...for the day care centers for anybody that wanted to put their children in.

SENATOR MARVEL: NO sir, that a...a...
