

many times. My own bill 961 will be another step. 957 hopefully will be another step that will correct the abuses that we have today in child support. I want to reaffirm once more that the most important part of that bill, the most important part of that bill is the procedure whereby we know to gather the information so that we have a determination as to how much child support is out-standing. We are not going to solve the problem until we know how much is outstanding. There are going to be all kinds of us that are going to stand here and I hope support children, time and time again. But the lowest form of human life as far as I am concerned is the man that will steal from his kids. That is what we have in this bill. If by the time the effects of 957 come into play, The reascal has not, has not paid his child support then it is a very small penalty to suggest that he only drive his auto to and from work. I suggest that you vote against the motion to indefinitely postpone the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I question whether the bill, as I stated before in its exact form that it is now, is constitutional but just finished reading a United States Supreme Court case which touches on the very point that I brought up earlier and I would suggest the following which would pretty much make it constitutional and that is that the bill be amended somewhere along the line here so that a hearing would occur with respect to the suspension of the license and at which time, at this hearing there would be a determination made to see whether the judgment, the child support judgment, rendered, against this particular individual would have any bearing upon, or...had any bearing or relationship upon his driving privileges. This way it would be constitutional because a person that might be far behind in his child support at this hearing might also be determined that he isn't carrying insurance and isn't capable in the case of an accident of covering himself and therefore is a danger to the public to the driving public. There is no doubt that the bill can be made constitutional and see or still achieve substantially what Senator Schmit wants it to in its present form, exactly as it is now, and I think it would have trouble. There is no doubt that it could be changed as I suggested and you would get United States Supreme Court opinions that can be found pretty close to this point. Don't kill it, it can be changed.

PRESIDENT: Are you all through discussing the motion to indefinitely postpone? Alright, Senator Fellman, Senator Kelly did you want to be heard on the issue? Motion is to indefinitely postpone the bill.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I would oppose the kill motion particularly with the enlightened words of Senator DeCamp which would indicate to me that those voting to kill are not voting on the technical basis that this is an unconstitutional bill, but on the fact that they don't want to strengthen the child support collection.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. Chairman, members, I certainly would not support.....
