CLERK: 28 10 11

PRESIDENT: Thank you, the amendment is adopted and we are now back to the rule change. The amendment as offered.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, we have a motion to indefinitely postpone the Johnson Rule change (Signed) Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, your motion now is in order.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature. I think the Rules change itself has been discussed, and I have don't have that much.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich we are still under a Call of the House

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't have that much to say right now. I will yield to any discussion that would need to be rebutted.

PRESIDENT: I'm sorry Senator Chambers I was on the phone. Your motion was just to indefinitely postpone. Senator Duis, go ahead, Sir.

SENATOR DUIS: I merely wanted to thank, Senator Chambers for being brief in this. I Asked this morning if we could be brief so we could get on with the business of this Legislature. So I thank you, Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stull, your light is on, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR STULL: I move the call be raised.

PRESIDENT: All right, the motion now is to raised the call. All those in favor of raising the call vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Call if raised. The motion now before the house is shall the Rule change be indefinitely postponed. All those in favor of indefinitely postponing the Rule change vote aye, all those opposed vote no. This is a motion to indefinitely postpone the Rule change. Once again have you all voted?
