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that we bring it up we will be glad to. I don't mean to hold this situation as far as General File is concerned, but we do act as a committee and when we vote these out of committee it is necessary to bring them to the floor of the Legislature.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson did you want to be recognized? Your light is on. Thank you. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I object. I think the Rule ought to be up now while we are in the frame of mind to adopt rules.

PRESIDENT: There is a motion to adopt the Rule.

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you very much. The Rule change here was brought by myself and heard in Rules Committee and advanced to the floor of the Legislature. It is an amendment to a Rule to Section 7, Paragraph B. Which says no member shall interrupt the business of the Legislature, nor speak to another who has on the floor, except where he may yield to a question. No guests shall be introduced during the Legislative session, except dignitaries. Guests not introduced may be inserted in the Journal by request. No member shall use profane language speaking to another member. In other words, what we're attempting here is the introduction of guests, so we won't do it during the business section of the Legislature. And we ask the adoption of the Rule change.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers did you want to speak to the Rule change.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This is just a question. Mr. President when will that rule that we just adopted take affect? Right now.

PRESIDENT: That Rule change became effective immediately. That applies to today's business.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Cavanaugh did you want to discuss the proposed Rule change. As being offered by Senator Duis.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Senator Duis does this mean that guests would be no longer introduced? During debate.

SENATOR DUIS: That's right.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Well, could they be introduced at all?

SENATOR DUIS: Only the dignitaries. They will be put into the Journal.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I really don't think we need the amendment. I think that the Chair can use it's discretion in this. In this matter. We spend enough time here flattering ourselves. We ought to flatter people who come down here once in awhile.
