Now last year, I watched on this floor as we overwhelmingly defeated the Equal Rights amendment and the reason we defeated the equal Rights amendments was because it was an insidious program to destroy motherhood and to break up the family. Well this bill goes far beyond the Equal Rights amendment would have ever done. This bill is going to literally destroy the family at the very beginning. The raising of the children. Wenn the federal of the state government starts giving you money to raise your children, they are also going to tell you how those children are going to be raised. And don't believe they won't. Now Senator Chambers, in recent years on this floor has explained how he was very upset because in the public schools they were using drugs influence the behavior of his children. Well we all know if you want to look at the record that the children of welfare people have more behavioral problems as they are growing up, maybe that the other children. The children of members of society in general. So the government reasonably could or should determine in year or so that it's time to start making changes or programs so that these children can come up and grow up equally benefited the same as other children.
