

SENATOR CARPENTER: Except one conclusion I presume from all of this that we can arrive at the belief that the Governor's staff as well as ours makes mistakes.

SENATOR MARVEL: That is absolutely true. It would be nice if the Governor's staff would admit it as our staff admitted it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, fellow members, I think that I am right on this. On one occasion last year, we asked one of the fiscal analyst how they arrived at a certain figure and he wet his thumb and held it up like that. It was just a... guess. Now in our committee, our budget committee. I would like to support them. We come in with the facts, solid facts, not just hold our thumb up and see which way the wind is blowing.

PRESIDENT: Senator F. Lewis, did you want to discuss the motion which is only to place 1059 directly on General File, behind 1058.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I just have a couple of questions of Senator Marvel.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel, yield?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Does this deficiency also include the state colleges?

SENATOR MARVEL: We have a deficiency for increased costs of utilities at Kearney State College.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: This doesn't include the legal fee increase of about 400% more than they appropriated.

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes, sir it does about \$16,000.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Would it be possible for us to have some detailed information on that deficiency when we debate the bill?

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes sir. We have got the detail.

PRESIDENT: Alright, the motion before us is to just place 1059 on General File to follow behind 1058. Question is do you want to support that motion? Question is do you want to support the motion. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Motion before us is to place 1059 on General File. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. Do we have other motions on the desk?

CLERK: Read Reference Committee Report. Motion by Senator Kennedy.

PRESIDENT: State your point Senator Schmit

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I ask for a point of personal privilege to answer a comment that
