We had a malfunction there for a minute. Well now, the Chair is going to apologize for some delay there because we had a malfunction of the board but the Chair's not going to leave the board open all morning and wait for you to vote on the issue. So now the question is, if you're going to support the issue, fine, let's vote. The issue is, do you want to adopt Senator F. Lewis' specific amendment to LB1024 on Select File. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. President, I'm reluctant to do this but I'm going to ask for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: All right, the Clerk will record...the Clerk will record and we'll have a Call of the House then. We'll determine that issue. Thank you. The next motion is do you support a call of the house. All those in favor of a call of the house on the issue vote aye. All those opposed vote no. This motion is for a Call of the House. CLERK: 14 ayes, 9 nays.

PRESIDENT: Under the rules of the Legislature, a simple majority is all that's necessary for a Call of the House. You are now under a Call of the House. At the next bell, please indicate your presence and I'd like to respectfully ask you to take your seats. Sergeant at Arms, round up the people in the rotunda. I think there is a committee meeting. CLERK: Senator Warner voting aye on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner voting aye. Please indicate your presence. Senator Nore, you haven't punched in, we're asking you to indicate your presence, would you please? Thank you, sir. Senator Nore voting no on the original issue. Senator Nore voting no. Senator Kelly voting no.

CLERK: He's already voted no.

PRESIDENT: Drop that.

CLERK: Senator Cal Carsten voting no.

PRESIDENT: We are asking you to indicate your presence so we can determine who is missing. We are under a Call of the House. Senator Burbach, do you understand the vote? Senator Burbach voting no.

CLERK: Senator Simpson voting aye. Senator Burbach voting no.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The issue under vote...Senator Anderson voting aye. Senator Mahoney voting aye. Senator Kremer, I'm sorry we're under a Call of the House. I'll have to ask you take your seat. Senator Stromer, would you please take your seat, we're under Call of the House. Senator Nore, please sit down, we're under Call of the House. Senator Waldron, would you please take your seat?
