PRESIDENT: And you want that laid over then, Senator Stull? Or do you want to take it up now? I don't see.....

SENATOR STULL: I think Senator Dickinson wanted to wait until tomorrow so let's lay it off overnight.

CLERK: You don't want to take up anything on it then? Okay. Just let that.....

PRESIDENT: Lay it over. Do we have other motions on the desk? Well, stand by, just a minute. Senator Dickinson, we just handled Senator Stull's motion here that he pulled out of the Journal and now the motion has been laid over on LB821, do you concur? Okay. Thank you. So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have notice of committee hearing. Signed by Senator Whitney that refers committee bills, that refers appointments, sets.....

PRESIDENT: Yeah, Senator Stull asked to withdraw the amendment that he had in the Journal and that's been withdrawn and he made the motion, etc. that LB821 be returned to Select File. But we didn't take it up at this time because he thought it was all right with you to lay it over until tomorrow. That that would be your wishes. Fine, we laid it over and let's leave it lay then. That's a good shot, thank you sir.
