PRESIDENT: Senator Whitney, let's be specific as to what you're saying. You want to take one vote, is this the Chair's understanding on all of these, is that correct? You're asking unanimous consent.....

SENATOR WHITNEY: One vote on all ten men.

PRESIDENT: All right, he's asking unanimous consent to take one vote on all ten appointees. Senator Simpson, that's the motion before us.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, I...I would object because I do not wish to oppose all of them but I do wish to vote against some of them.

PRESIDENT: Thank you and there are now objections, Senator Whitney. You'll have to withdraw your unanimous consent motion. You'll have to move if that's your choice.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Senator Simpson, could you pick out those you want to vote on separately and then I'll ask unanimous consent to take care of all of those....Okay, I have conversed with Senator Simpson and he wishes to take the members of the Parole Board separately and, therefore, I ask unanimous consent to take care of all of the others which would be on pages 1192-93 at the same time. That means six of them, no, it would be Marvin Jewell-Public Employees Retirement Board; Robert Kramer-Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing Board; Howard Burdick-Public Employees Retirement Board; Daniel Ramsey-State Highway Commission; and Dale Sailors-Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing Board. Take those up at the same time. I ask unanimous consent.

PRESIDENT: All right now, do you all understand the motion? Senator Whitney is asking unanimous consent to with one vote confirm the appointments of all of those appointees of the Governor's that are found on pages 1192-93 with the exception of those Parole Board members and they would be voted on separately. That is the motion before the House and the Chair is now asking do you have any objections to that? The only ones we would vote on separately would be the Parole Board members. Would you object to having the others handled in one vote? Any objections? All right, hearing none, so ordered then. Senator Whitney, go ahead, sir.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Okay, now the persons involved then is first Marvin Jewell-PILB. No one spoke against him. We had senators (three) who spoke in favor of him. Robert Kramer-MVILB. No one appeared against him, no one voted against him. Howard Burdick-PERB, same thing. Daniel Ramsey, SHC, same thing, nobody voted against him nor appeared against him. Dale Sailors-MVILB, same thing. Mr. President, I move that all of these men, these appointees of the Governor be approved by this Legislature, that I have just read.

PRESIDENT: Do you need to discuss the motion? Then the question is, do you want to confirm the appointments as listed by Senator Whitney? You're doing it with one vote with the exception of the Parole Board members which are not a part of this motion. All of those in favor of the confirmation vote aye. All those opposed vote no. You are voting on the confirmation of the Governor's appointees as outlined by Senator Whitney. The Parole Board members are not included in this particular vote. Thank you. Clerk will record.
