CLERK: Read vote. (Found on page 1213 of Journal).
30 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Very good, the appointments are confirmed.
Now, Senator Whitney, back to you.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Now, Mr. President, we'll take up the Parole Board separately. I'm talking from page 1190 of the Journal. I move that we approve the appointment of Edward Rowley, Board of Parole. No one appeared either in support or against him. I move that we approve Mr. Rowley.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to approve...is to confirm the appointment of Mr. Rowley to the Parole Board. All those in favor of confirming that appointment vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Voting on the confirmation of Mr. Ed Rowley to the Parole Board. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record. Read the results.

CLERK: Read vote. (Found on page 1214 of Legislative Journal). 26 ayes, no nays.

PRESIDENT: The appointment is confirmed. Senator Whitney, over to you.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Now, we have our confirmation of the appointment of Timothy Blankenship, Board of Parole. Senators who voted in favor of him were Senators Barnett, Duis, Epke, Johnson, Luedtke, Nore, Stromer, Stull and Whitney. The three senators who voted against him were Senators Chambers, Snyder and Wiltse. Absent and not voting was Senator Stahmer. I move for the confirmation of the appointment of Timothy Blankenship, Board of Parole.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion? All right then, the question is, do you want to confirm the appointment of Blankenship to the Board of Control....to the Board of Parole, excuse me. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Read vote. (Found on page 1214 of Journal).
30 ayes, 3 nays, 16 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The appointment is confirmed. Now, Senator Whitney, over to you.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. We now have up for confirmation John B. Greenholtz, Board of Parole. No one appeared either in favor or in opposition to Mr. Greenholtz at the hearing. A letter in support of Mr. Greenholtz was received by the committee from W. C. Olenburg, Chaplain, Nebraska Penal and Correctional Complex. Those voting in favor of him on the committee were Barnett, Duis, Johnson, Luedtke, Snyder, Stull, Whitney and Wiltse. No one voted against him. Present and not voting, Senator Stahmer. Absent and not voting Senators Chamber, Epke, Nore and Stromer. I move for the confirmation of this appointment.

PRESIDENT: Do you need to discuss the motion? The question is, do you want to confirm the appointment? All those in favor of the confirmation of the appointment of John Greenholtz, vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.
