CLERK: Read vote. (Found on page 1215 of Journal).

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett, Senator Barnett voting aye.
Senator Hasebroock voting aye.

CLERK: Continue vote reading. 33 ayes, 2 nays, remainder
not voting.

PRESIDENT: The appointment is confirmed. Over to you,
Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President and members of the
Legislature. We have now for consideration Mr. Marshall
M. Tate, Board of Parole. No one appeared either in favor
or opposition to Mr. Tate. Those voting in favor of him
were Senators Barnett, Duis, Johnson, Luedtke, Snyder,
Stull, Whitney and Wiltse. There were no votes against
him. Present and not voting, Senator Stahmer. Absent and
not voting, Senators Chambers, Epke, Nore and Stromer. I
move for the confirmation of Mr. Tate, Board of Parole.

PRESIDENT: The question is if you want to confirm the
appointment, vote aye. If not vote no. You are voting on
the appointment of Mr. Marshall Tate to the Parole Board.
Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Read vote. (Found on page 1215 of Journal).
30 ayes, 0 nays, 19 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Totals are?

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, 19 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, the appointment is confirmed. Over
to you, Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Now, we have the last man up for con-
firmation for today, Eugene E. Neal, Board of Parole. No
one appeared either for or against Mr. Neal. Those senators
voting for him are Senators Barnett, Epke, Johnson, Luedtke,
Snyder, Stromer, Whitney and Wiltse. Voting against were
Senator Chambers. Present and not voting, Senators Duis,
Nore and Stull. Absent and not voting, Senator Stahmer.
I move for the confirmation of Mr. Neal, Board of Parole.
