SENATOR FELLMAN: No, I think the bill goes right at the area of monopoly, would cover the area where the two of us have 90% and would exclude the area where the two of us have 20%.

SENATOR KELLY: Well, see now I violently oppose the example that you're using. Two 45% go together for 90%, let's not have any of that. I agree with that completely.

SENATOR FELLMAN: You do or you don't?

SENATOR KELLY: No, I agree that we should not have.....

SENATOR FELLMAN: You agree that if two 45's go together and together control 90, that that's wrong?

SENATOR KELLY: They're bad guys, let's hit them hard.

PRESIDENT: Gentlemen, now may the Chair intervene here for just a minute and let me point out something. And that is that the motion is to return LB1028 and I know that it's difficult to determine whether you want to return it or not and then whether we're going to debate the amendment or not.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Well, who's....return it for what amendments?

PRESIDENT: All right, the specific amendment was offered by Senator Proud and I think that amendment is to strike certain sections of the bill if the Chair remembers correctly. But actually I would like to try and maneuver the discussion down to the return of the bill and then we can argue the merits of the specific amendment because it's not open to anything else other than the specific amendment offered by Senator Proud at this time. And that's kind of a limiting thing. Go ahead, Senator Fellman, do you understand what I'm trying to do?

SENATOR FELLMAN: I'd like to ask Senator Proud what the specific amendment is that he's interested in.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: Well, you.....

PRESIDENT: Senator Proud.....care to respond?

SENATOR PROUD: Understand that Enrollment and Review renumbered so my amendment is to strike sections 3 and 4.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Is that the one that.....

SENATOR PROUD: Those are original sections 6 and 7 found on page 1057 of the Journal for March 11.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Well, wait....let's talk about substance and not numbers.

SENATOR PROUD: Well, you're asking the question. Go ahead.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Well, but are you dealing with the amendment on the railroads?

SENATOR PROUD: No....well.....

SENATOR FELLMAN: Is that the one you wanted.....
