SENATOR BARNETT: They....they haven't....they haven't offered amendments for any of that wording?

SENATOR MARVEL: No, sir, not that I'm aware of. No sir.

SENATOR BARNETT: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: We still have before the Body the committee amendments.

SENATOR MARVEL: All right now, Mr. President, I think that the next move then to try to move along is to propose the adoption of this standing committee amendment to LB1053 which simply establishes the priorities and...and the priorities for the information of the Legislature have to do with the total figures that are on page 12, line 7-10. There is no additional money. This is simply tying down priorities which is a...which is a goal of the committee in each of the major areas of state government. So, I'd think then we'd put this on the board for a vote, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right. Is there need for further discussion? Then, the question is, if you are in favor of the amendments, the committee amendments of LB1053 which amend pages 9, 10, 11, and 12 and lines 7-10 on page 12, vote aye. If not, vote no. You're voting on the committee amendments to LB1053. Have you all voted? Clerk will record. Read the totals.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendments are adopted. Senator Marvel, back to you.

SENATOR MARVEL: Now, Mr. President, the...Vince, you have....you have the sheet that contains two amendments. We have adopted the first one and I would ask you that we read the second one and then I'll ask Senator Stahmer to respond to it. Do you have it with...up there?

CLERK: Construing your having adopted the whole thing.

SENATOR MARVEL: We adopt....no, just adopted the first amendment.

CLERK: Why, I think it's all one amendment.

SENATOR MARVEL: No.

CLERK: Well, what to you is the first amendment? Program 351?

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes sir.

CLERK: And what to you is the second one?

SENATOR MARVEL: Well, the second one starts, is on what is marked page 5, on page 16 after line 3, insert the following.

CLERK: Okay, okay, okay, I'm with you.

SENATOR MARVEL: And then I think you can take 2 and 3 together because the third one simply is a corrective matter. But I think the second one basically ought to be explained
