SENATOR CARPENTER: You have just the same chance on Select File as you have on General File. Personally I don't want to discuss it.

SENATOR KEYES: OK.

PRESIDENT: As soon as we can get the Senators in their seats then, lets try something else this morning. The Chair is unaware if there are any long bills on this list, but I think we are going to have to require that the Senators stay in the chamber and then if that doesn't work, the Chair is going to request that the Sergeant at Arms not allow you out of the chamber, then if that doesn't work the Chair will rule that you will be in your seats, which is what is required on Final Reading anyway. I really don't think that you should get as far away as happened yesterday and I had some criticism of course as I think was probably justified for some of the looseness on the floor during the 234 page bill, but it is up to me I think to keep the rules, and enforce them until you say otherwise, so that is the way that I would like to have it this morning and I would like to try it. Lets see what develops. Senator Carstens.

SENATOR F. CARSTENS: Mr. President, it doesn't do any good to allow people to roam around in this legislature, if at the same time lobbyists, some of whom are employed legislature are allowed to wonder around inside the gates and allowed to lobby around and will nor does it help if the lobbyists outside of the gates can during the interim when the bill is being read silently actively operate as lobbyists to change the votes of this legislature to which they were not able to do before. Now if we are going to have this we are going to have to clean this whole thing up. I am not satisfied with what went on yesterday, I think that it tainted the legality of the entire bill. I intend to look into this and I'm not through with it, but this is for future bills. What went on yesterday was a disgrace. It was a particular disgrace because it was carried on by people who are paid by the tax payers. I want this included, if we are going to sit here we are going to sit here the constitution states that the bill and all the amendments thereto shall be printed and read at large and I don't think that means at large by a wondering circus.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, I would just like to briefly second what Senator Carpenter said about adopting the standing committee amendment on General File, in fact this is roughly what I had in mind I thought might happen if the rules were adopted which was to ask for 25 votes on General File. I think that now we have a good opportunity to really address ourselves in committee amendments, advance the bill and then if there is any worthwhile amendments they can be taken care of on Select File, take no more votes than they would have on General File.
