I want this legislature to know that I didn't make a report to the budget committee. Because the report had not been completed. I wrote up a tentative statement, and then I asked the college of agriculture employees to check my figures and get together with our fiscal analysis and come back to me and so that we could make a study of what this was on. They broke a confidence. They broke a confidence to me. I asked them to come back to me and let us go over our figures and see what the situation is. I want to help you people if I can. So now they send back a letter and they use the word deception and a bunch of words that are just completely wrong and trying to point out that my report is wrong, and I haven't even given a report. I haven't even given a report because I want it a...a...a...I wanted their input in this before I made a report, so I just want you to know that this report is or has never been made, the budget committee doesn't have the report and they broke a confidence and I don't know who or how they can expect the budget committee to help them out when they operate on this kind of a basis.
