SENATOR CARPENTER: I move that 782 be advanced to E & R for Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: And now the motion is to advance 782 as amended. All those in favor of the advancement of the bill please say aye. So ordered. The bill is advanced. When we recessed this noon, we still had the Richendifer motion that was with us. It is in order, and that was to print the underlined bills that the Chair understands the motion correctly. To print the underlined bills, under the A Bills on General File. Senator Richendifer is that the essence of the motion.

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: Mr. President, I would just call for the question.

PRESIDENT: The question is, do you support the motion to print the underlined bills under the A bills on General File. All those in favor of the Richendifer motion will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. It does take 25 votes. PRESIDENT: Is it the bills that would be set for a day certain would be by-passed as the Chair understands it under this motion.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I object to that, and I think that would be wrong.

PRESIDENT: All right, that's the understanding of the motion. Senator Stahmer, for what purpose do you rise.

SENATOR STAHMER: Well, I'd like to speak against the motion. I would like to see the speaker of this body exert some influence and he's got the power to set these bills in proper preference. And I wish someone would decide for what's good for the state instead of giving every Senator his mickey mouse little favor. I've got some faith in that Speaker. I helped to work to elect him, but I wish somebody would work up a list of bills that are important for the state and forget about who cares about what bill.

PRESIDENT: We are still debating the Richendifer motion. Senator Proud.
