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perhaps to that amendment. But that is really the question here, and try to cover that. Thank you. Now, Senator Marsh did you want to be heard again on the Goodrich amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: To make a comment that when we're talking, when Senator Goodrich was talking about income to the ADC families. He was not talking about spendable income. No woman or no family ever receives money for medical payments. Those payments go to the medical personnel. She may not be sick, but she still is given credit for her medical expenses. And you can't consider something that she never has as spendable income. As part of her total package, when you are talking about how much money she has to spend. Let's reject these amendments and get on.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis. We are discussing the Goodrich amendments.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I think I can phrase Senator Carpenter's question to fit the Goodrich amendment. If we adopt the Goodrich amendment we would be adopting the bill that you have and is that the Governor's wishes.

PRESIDENT: You are asking Senator Kennedy. Would you care to respond, Sir. Senator Kennedy.

SENATOR KENNEDY: I would answer this way, that the Governor's bill would \$5 more, the way I understand the amendment.

SENATOR DUIS: What I'm trying to say, he had..the Goodrich amendment is at \$165. The bill that would...

SENATOR KENNEDY: That is correct for one child, the same as the Governor's.

SENATOR DUIS: That's what I'm getting at. Would that be the Governor's wishes.

SENATOR KENNEDY: I would say up to a point for the one child and a mother. Yes.

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion now. All right, Senator Goodrich do you want to close. Senator Goodrich is now closing on his second amendment.

SENATOR GOODRICH: O.K. I'd like to respond to two things. One is the spendable income. If the mother took full advantage of the food stamp program, her spendable income would \$340 per month, comparing that with the \$307 that the Department of Welfare says is the standard of needs that she needs. Now, the other comment that I would make, is the decision that we have to make is how much are we going to invest in the program in this increased amount of money that we're giving these people. And are we going to make it a million seven hundred and fifty thousand, or are we going to make a million nine hundred thousand. The million... if you...That's my amendment ..if you adopt my amendment you are limiting the increase to a million seven hundred and fifty thousand dollars and this is still regardless of how you play with the figures, it's still a 35% increase this year in the amount that the ADC recipients get. I would the adoption of my amendment.
