collected from those who are probably more able to pay than any of those who are paying because they don't have the same privilege and the same opportunity to avoid taxation. Not to evade it. And now this amendment, it sets up 750,000 dollars which is earmarked for the auditing of income tax reports, both Nebraska income tax corporations and those who operate without the state of Nebraska and within it also as the matter of their type of corporation.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, you have one minute.

SENATOR CARPENTER: O.K. that's enough for an important business like this. We set for 750,000 of General Fund for that purpose. In addition to that if you are going to get people of this quality that sets up the category, if they could be employed, including CPA's which you can't hire for a few thousand. Just think the head of the Tax Commissioner of this department gets \$17,000 a year, and he handles millions and billions of dollars of business and I don't blame him for being discouraged and not doing really much of anything. I move for the adoption.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, and members of the body. I apologize, Senator Carpenter for..he passed out a copy of this amendment, if he did I did not receive it on the desk.. Were they passed out Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter yield to a question.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I can't answer, but I'll give you what I have no objection to passing them out what I have.

SENATOR STAHMER: Senator Carpenter, I don't think this bill is going to be advanced, but in no way wish to imply that I'm going to speak against this amendment. But I would like to have a copy of it, and I would like this to be held over and then held the final vote up, until we all have a copy and can study it.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I have no objection to mo..holding the bill over and putting it on Select File and attempting the amendments there.

SENATOR STAHMER: No, I don't think we are going to advance the bill tonight, anyway, are we or...And that's what I meant. I mean it will still be on General File. You can still offer it this on General File.

SENATOR CARPENTER: May I ask unanimous consent to print the amendment in the Journal.
