very briefly and I intended to do this before Monday, because I thought we were going to discuss this Monday. The Governor says, "I have no pride in authorship of the ADC bill. He said, My insistence when I asked you to put it in was that there would be a bill in here, and the bills are similar. He said, I will sign either bill. I want to bring that report to you that the Governor says, "I am concerned with the mother and the children and not the authorship of the bill" And I felt that I could say that before, but I did not have the Governor's O.K. to say it, and I wanted to find out first. So I hope that you will take this very seriously. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, I would like to ask Senator Carpenter a question. Concerning what he has been talking about. What are the findings of the spot audits that have been taken.

SENATOR CARPENTER: You mean of the amounts that they have recovered.

SENATOR NORE: Yes.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I cannot tell you. And while we are talking Mr. President, I also have another amendment for the same bill which has to do with the highway department in which I did pass out. I presume everyone got one, but if you haven't I have no objection to printing this in the Journal also. So those who didn't get it and those who were not in this body would also have a copy of what we are talking about. Because this too, is also I think a very important amendment. And it deals with a surplus of twenty million dollars in the Highway Department. Now, I ask Mr. President, to send this to the desk and print it in the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Any objections, printing it in the Journal. If not. So ordered. Senator Marvel for what reason do you stand.

SENATOR MARVEL: Well, I was going to proceed with the bill.

PRESIDENT: Are there any further amendments on the desk, in this area, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Yes.

PRESIDENT: We have further amendments on the desk.

SENATOR MARVEL: I'm sorry.

CLERK: Senator Richendifer asked for one, but he has been excused.

PRESIDENT: Who?

CLERK: Senator Richendifer. But he's been excused.

PRESIDENT: Any objections to passing over this, and printing it in the Journal. If not. So ordered. Further amendments.
