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mind and he's now ..he will refund the campaign contributions, which I think is an honorable thing to do. And, but..he would be under this law, I think. He would probably go to jail, because he had done everything up to ..up in favor of filing, but he didn't file and put his money down and so he was still a candidate but he didn't put his money down. Now I think that he would have been in violation. And just because the person has the right to change their minds. We always say people have a right to change their mind. Where there can be a circumstances from day to day that cause the person to change his mind whether he is going to file for a particular office or not. And to hold him to something. I think the statement that politicians make relative to filing should be held to the greatest...with a grain of salt. I think that the average person that reads these things agrees with me but to put it in law, and put him in jail if he doesn't follow through on filing, I think it's terrible. I do not think that anyone that has filed for an office until he has put his money down and filled out the necessary paper at the Election Commissioner with the state. Therefore, I think this is a dangerous bill, I think you should strike the enacting clause and get on with doing some other bills. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Now, Senator Warner. For what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR WARNER: Well, to ask Senator Syas a question.

PRESIDENT: All right, he is the introducer of the bill. He has that privilege. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: If I could just ask you Senator Syas if you read the bottom of the page 2 it indicates that you already have to file. If you accept any money whether you filed or not. My question is, where in the bill do you suggest that there is wording that states that you could not, in response to Senator Nore's question, indicated that you could file for one office and then file for another and be in violation. There is not a place where I am aware of that ..that there's any wording that has that purpose of that intent, or affect.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, I disagree with you, Senator Warner, on page 3 you say that if you make a statement at a public meeting, whatever a public meeting is, I'd like you to give me the definition, you file.

SENATOR WARNER: Now, it says you have to report.

SENATOR SYAS: You..Pardon.

SENATOR WARNER: You have to report contributions is all.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, that isn't the way I read it.

SENATOR WARNER: You should read the new language. Have you read...I'd like to ask a question. Have you read the new language in context with the entire section?

SENATOR SYAS: Well, I know what he's referring to the money, also. But the way I look at it, that a person that makes a statement, he...even with the money that he collects. As I say he might have had the best of intentions, and as long as he refunds it, which is the honorable thing to do. What's do..
