PRESIDENT: Once again, the motion now before the house, is shall 877 be returned to Select File for specific amendment and that amendment would be to strike the enacting clause. CLERK: 17 ayes, 20 nays.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion on the desk.

CLERK: I move to return 877 to Select File for specific amendment, to strike the new language on page 3 lines 1 through 7. (Signed) Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers for his motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature. I gave the reasons why I think this language ought not be included in the bill. So unless there are questions, I don't have any additional comment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Certainly.
