SENATOR NORE: Is it in cash, or could it be in kind.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, do you care to respond.

SENATOR WARNER: Ask that question again, Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Would the \$1,000 limitation be in cash, or could it be in kind.

SENATOR WARNER: It could not be in scash, Senator Nore. You recall we passed a bill the other day prohibiting cash to \$50 or less, so...

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SENATOR NORE: But it can't be any more, just in kind.

SENATOR WARNER: In kind? There is no reference to any bills that I'm aware of, Senator Nore, that refers to...I assume that it's something other than money? In terms of help. There is limitations they have to report contributions which are of say, they give them stamps or run a machine. A postage machine or something like that would have to be shown as a contribution that's the present law. That doesn't have nothing to do with the new bill.

SENATOR NORE: O.K.

PRESIDENT: I want to remind the body that again we are on final reading. If I could casually just call that to your attention. There was some criticism last week for those who were wondering the floor, and that perhaps there was some extra legal lobbying that went on. Now, Senator Chambers. See..excuse me Senator Syas is next, and then Senator Chambers.

SENATOR SYAS: Just one thing to, I think maybe what Senator Nore was thinking about, and maybe not. But there have been times in political campaigns. Where a candidate or a political party, either one has been donated, the use of a building or a rooms in a building which is not money and we..you don't write checks. Some owner has said while you during the campaign you can have this for your office, here's the empty building, here's the furniture. That is contributing to a campaign or not, and if Senator Nore was thinking about along that line in kind. I think it actually exists in a big way in many instances.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter. We are on final reading. I wonder if you would like to take your seat. Senator Warner do you care to respond.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I would like to refer both Senator Syas and Senator Nore to page 4, starting with line 9 which is the old language which shows you which is now covered, and all those things would be covered. Senator Chambers do you want to close. Senator Chambers is now closing on his motion to return 877 to Select File for specific amendment. That is to knock out I think Section 3. Senator Chambers is now closing.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, the first thing that ought to be made clear and all of us in this body know it. When a bill is returned to Select File from Final Reading. The only thing that can be considered is the specific amendment. This is not a method by which the bill can be killed. The only thing that can be done on Select File if the bill is returned is to adopt
