SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I just stopped in this morning, yes.

SENATOR BARNETT: Was he in agreement with...

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I also added the emergency clause to that. He wants that on there.

SENATOR BARNETT: He is in agreement with what you are trying to do. As I understood this bill from Senator Maresh, you said that this is what the Secretary of State wanted. And there has been a meeting since, and this is what he wants done. Right?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: The Secretary of State is a little confused.

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, I won't argue that point, but I'm asking is he in agreement now?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Yes.

SENATOR BARNETT: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Skarda, and then Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR SKARDA: Mr. President, a question to the chair.

PRESIDENT: Yes, Sir.

SENATOR SKARDA: Did we adopt the Chambers amendment, or where is it at?

PRESIDENT: 877 has been returned to Select File.

SENATOR SKARDA: Can we adopt or consider another amendment on it. Without adopting the Chambers amendment.

PRESIDENT: No. It can be ret...

SENATOR SKARDA: Well, don't you think then we ought to get back to the track. It is my understanding that we've got to do one or the other. Youve got to adopt the amendment or reject it.

PRESIDENT: You are on 897.

SENATOR SKARDA: I know what you are on, it's on Final Reading isn't it?

PRESIDENT: Right, we are on Final REading not Select File. And I'll take up Select File when we get back to it. We may have the whole batch here on Final REading returned, Senator Skarda. That's my problem here now. All right, Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Senator Cavanaugh would you yield to a question?

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh yield?

SENATOR MAHONEY: Senator Cavanaugh, the other day, I believe it was Friday. We met with the Secretary of State and SENator Maresh. And on page 11, we discussed that provision, that is the stricken language starting with line 17 and continuing to line 22. Are either of your amendments here? Going to take care of that particular situation.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Right, I reinstate that language, Senator Mahoney adding after the word elective office, on line 17, created by act of the Legislature, and I strike that language that pertains to being a candidate, because that language is inoperative, and
