SENATOR CARPENTER: The motion says you see where 675, the last underlined bill, any bill after that on General File would be indefinitely postponed. That's what it does, nothing else.

SENATOR WHITNEY: So, bills to be brought up from committee then and put on General File would still be considered by the Legislature

SENATOR CARPENTER: That's right. I realize you have to do this piece meal. But this may be too rich for the blood, even this.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas did you wish to be heard.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, I think Senator Carpenters answered my question. I..all I a..was going to say was that I was going to have three public hearing and on resolutions, and it's all right with me...but they have to be treated as bills and there is one of them is his, and one of them is Senator Stammers and one is Senator Mahoney's. And he says he..they are not affected to..so it's all right with me, but I just wanted to attract your attention, but I do think that one thing that any Senator that doesn't have a bill up there, should be allowed to put one up there if he hasn't got one real quick like. Now, I was saying Senator, I haven't got one. The reason Senator Carpenter, I was saving mine, because I figures that somebody on one of your Resolutions might need a sponsor on an underlined bill, and I might of...consented to that, but now since I'm pressed for time, put 718 up there, that's my bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I'd like to ask Senator Carpenter a question.

PRESIDENT: Do you yield to a question, Senator.

SENATOR STULL: Now, you partially answered this from a question of Senator Syas, but if I understand your motion, if the constitution

if the constitutional Revision Committee reports the resolutions that's going to be heard Wednesday and Thursday to the floor. We would not take action on them this year.

SENATOR CARPENTER: No, that doesn't say that at all. It says only one thing and you can't read anything else into it. Every bill that is on General File now, disregarding anything in committee after 677 down through 1016 is indefinitely postponed. That is all it does.

SENATOR STULL: In other words then, if these bills were reported out they would be considered and the one's that are not underlined on the boards would go down the drain.
