as an administration building and a kitchen should be used for both the mental health and the veterans. If we can't run those institutions in a business-like manner, I want to be sure that it is clarified and we have already talked about having a summer study a clarification of what buildings will be whose. Now we do have a problem that the federal people say that they have a majority in the kitchen for the per diem and the payment of per diem and I have stated that here very clearly the other day and Senator John DeCamp, I wish that he would tend some of the many meetings that we have had at night, through the day time the past six years and definitely clarify what the intent of the people is. The budget committee has come up I think with a real good program, I have been working with them very seriously. I'm going to be here two more years. This I know. I will still be fighting for the same programming of that institution. Now to make that institution stronger we need the veterans and it is very clear in anybody's mind that has been there and looked, but we have one administration building, now do we need two? I say no, as a businessman. We need that facility for both those institutions. Now what I wanted to clarify and thought that I did, in asking the questions that I did a little bit ago, can we do that? And I think that we can. All I have to do is bring in an A B C contract and let you senators look at it and talk sensibly about it and when we have both the veterans and the mental institution people in coordination and again it is difficult when you have bureautic set-ups as we do. I think the intent of 1051 is not to discuss it at this time this year. I hate to put it in that plain language, but the intent is to be sure that we are able to use the buildings that are up there and use them in a business-like manner and we must clarify each building in a five year program which budget people have definitely said that they are going to do. I want to be sure that we are going to follow through with that intent that I have followed through in the past six years. I think that it is clarified and I think that it is on the record here. I want to be sure that a certain amount of money for that institution is there. That certain amounts of money for air-conditioning the same that we put into the kitchen and I am here to say again, lets clarify what we are doing. Lets forget about the false rumors. Lets be solid in what we are doing and who knows who is going to be on this floor two years to four years from now. I can't tell you but I'll guarantee you that while I'm here that institution is going to stand solid, and I have said that before many times. I just want to clarify once and for all 1051 and you all know where it is, it should have never been discussed and I think that it is kind of ridiculous to get into an argument that shouldn't even be brought up.
