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and easy and they will be sent to what I call out of their habitat where they have grown north-east Nebraska Norfolk is geographically located and I think that we have a lot to fear. So, we need one or the other, and eventually we are going to have to have a new building and it will be feasible. Mr. LaMonte presented a new building to us here about four years ago to the budget committee and after he left the institutions why, it was forgotten about. It is too bad that we didn't go ahead then. At the present time a new building would probably not be economically feasible within a very few years it will be. I want these mentally and mental patients, domicled in their habitats. That is northeast Nebraska, not Siberia. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator F. Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I had a question for Senator Marvel and while we were waiting for him to return I would make a few other comments that I think are germane to some of the comments that Senator Carpenter made and I suppose now is as good as time as any to make those, if the chair would give me that liberty I would appreciate it. After an analysis of dollars available from Eldon I'm just like you, I see that we are hard pressed for dollars right now at a bare minimum based upon his statistics without as you noticed his statistics did not include the 14 million statutory reserve which if you talk about collecting that over a half a year period which we are going to get down to if we do this in January, we are talking about a minimum increase of 3% on the income tax and I would suggest to you as we continue to add dollars that that is going to continue to go up, up, and up, and I agree with Senator Carpenter that we have to decide to put our money where our mouth is and so I am quite willing to say that forget the idea of raising the tax and as an alternative lets set that tax rate November 1st. Lets do that November 1st so the people that really want to spend money and tell the people that, lets let them notify the people that that happens lets say at least a week or so before the general election and get the reaction. Now I have some other comments and I have some other things to say about that a little later on, but what is more germane Mr. President, but I do have a question for Senator Marvel.

SPEAKER: Senator Marvel.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I was talking on the bill and on taxes till you got here, I was treading water.

SENATOR MARVEL: You mean you are adlibbing until we get back to the budget.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yes, I thought that would be fair. Senator Marvel I think that there is some concern, at least on my part as to your committees interpretation of the direction that is being taken at the Norfolk Center. I wonder if those kind of statistics are available to us in number of patient reductions in some of the fiscal lay-out of that property over there. I have some real concerns about retaining them, the center myself. Maybe I could ask this kind of question. Has the committee looked at this...at the trend that is taking place up there and do you have any reactions to that?

SENATOR MARVEL: I would like to speak generally to this area because it is important. That is the reason that some of us
