SENATOR DUIS: Well then, Senator Marvel, what is it that I read then about the fact that we're not doing for penal reform? What situation is it? There's over \$8 million of General Fund money and a total of over \$11 million, in fact, \$11,600,000 and some thousand toward penal reform. Does that seem adequate?

SENATOR MARVEL: Well, it seems adequate to me in the area of developing programs, yes, sir, and that is where we put our stress and that is spelled out in those, in those, on those pages as I indicated.

SENATOR DUIS: Well, then, what the Budget Committee is doing then is stressing the programs in penal reform?

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes, sir, and I guess we get criticism from the area of capital construction.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I would like to also comment on suggestion that this is adequate and I certainly agree, Senator Duis and Senator Marvel, that the programatic approach to corrections is extremely important. In fact, the Appropriations Committee met on several occasions and the chairmen of the two respected committees met to work to work out these two programatic approaches to corrections. So the Judiciary Committee and the Advisory Committee.....
