You see, my friends, the State of Nebraska generally doesn't do anything unless it's cheap. That's part of our problem. It has to be cheap. We're not interested in need, we're interested in none other things. And I think it's a horrible example that the State of Nebraska, that the Governor of this state has not recommended nor will he nor has he to pay Mr. Peters who is a mainstay in the whole fiscal analysis of this state more than \$17,000 a year.

PRESIDENT: And now are you ready for the question? The question is, the adoption of the Carpenter amended as amended by the Burbach amendment. All those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Roll Call vote...roll call vote's been withdrawn.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Governor's opposed to it.

PRESIDENT: All right. Clerk call the Roll. You're voting on the Carpenter amendment as amended by the Burbach amendment. Call the Roll, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Roll Call vote.

CLERK: Continue Roll Call vote. 28 ayes, 12 nays, 9 not voting, Mr. President.
