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we're talking of terms of a visitation team made up of industry, concerned citizens, peer groups analysis, my question is, are we trying to get down to really are these areas of salable skills, is that what you're concerned about? Are we really concerned about quality education as a general term?

SENATOR MARVEL: We're concerned about the general area of quality which includes skills but we're talking about the total quality as far as I'm concerned.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Well, I've probably beat that horse to death. I'm not really enthused on...unless we get to specifics and I think we've been through several of those before.

SENATOR MARVEL: I would suggest to you that if you will examine this bill, you will find that we are down to specifics because we're tying money to particular areas. I don't know how you can get any more specific than this frankly.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke and then Senator Nore. Senator Nore, I've had these lights on. His...Senator Luedtke has had his light on longer than you have. Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Will Senator Marvel yield to a question?

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes sir.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Senator Marvel, on page 46, following line 16, I just want to ask you a question. The enumeration of certain activities in areas of excellence. It would not be interpreted, would it, to include...or preclude say the College of law or other activities of the University, not just the law college in Lincoln, from qualification as to areas of excellence in accordance with a criteria to be funded from the Chancellor's discretionary funds?

SENATOR MARVEL: It's my understand that there are some connected with the College of Law who would also like to be involved in this. And there's nothing I know of that would exclude this, no sir. And also this list, this priority list that's set up here now was established by the representative groups as I've indicated. There's no, there's no arbitrary decision made by fiscal staff in this area. In other....

SENATOR LUEDTKE: In other words.....

SENATOR MARVEL: It would not exclude the use of Chancellor's discretionary fund in connection with the Law College.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: In other words, they can properly expend for those purposes?

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes sir.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Okay. Now the other question and this goes to page 45, back on page 45. Would you confirm that if the \$50,000 which is provided in there for the law library, if that had not been so designated, it would not have been given to the general library continuation fund. In other words, the law library appropriation did not under the present circumstances cost the general library fund anything?
