But at the same time if some property tax relief isn't given to some of these people that are paying large amounts of property taxes, you're not going to have them paying them indefinitely into the future. As I say, I am not going to support Senator Warner or the Governor on this. My vote when made will attempt to be a reflection very honestly what I think is best for the people in my area and also the degree that coincides with what they want. It will be a vote to reflect that also.

PRESIDENT: The Chair has been properly critized for taking the vote too fast on the motion to cease debate. I did have...have had a number of lights up here for a long time but still it's not the Chair's option to decide. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I will support the motion to override the Governor's veto on state support for education. And I do this for the children of the State of Nebraska. I do feel as though with proper support of education on a state level, that we will enhance the opportunity of the children of the State of Nebraska to arrive at an equal education. And I think this is most necessary especially in this day and age. I also believe and I have a philosophy, that property taxes should be collected for expenditures within the local communities of the cities and the counties and expended for those services such as roads, buildings and such as that. And I do believe the sales and income tax is a personal tax and should be used for education. And insofar as I am able, I would like to see the majority part or as big a part of the sales and income tax to be used for education rather than the property tax. The property tax, I believe, can be used for the construction of a building, for other expenditures and the protection of property, etc. but I do believe and I would like to see as much state support for education come from the sales and income tax as is possible but still retain local control. And anyone who says there's no local control in this state support bill or any other state support bill we had before us is wrong. And I do wish to support this because of the equal opportunity of education for children.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I too am supporting the override for LB772. State Aid to Education is one thing. The increases of taxes or the decreases of taxes is another thing. Please don't confuse the two. They're not the same issue. Education in Nebraska is a Nebraska responsibility that if you don't think so, just take a look. How many of you here in the Legislature married a spouse that went to high school with you? Now, we're a rather old group as far as Nebraska goes. Today the kids do not marry each other as they get out of high school. Those parochial days are gone forever. We move and move fast in this society and we should be responsible for our brother's children no matter what town, what school they're going to.
