

SENATOR BURBACH: The roads which the Game Commission, the recreational roads set up in their one year plan. They are the Riverview state recreational area at the cost of \$109,000, the Sherman Reservoir recreational area of \$200,000 and the Stooly Park Recreational Area at \$65,000 and the Big Indian Reservoir State Special Use Area and Natural Resource District, \$250,000; Plattsmout State Use Area, \$65,000; Cottonmill State Recreational Area, \$200,000; McKilder State Special Use area, \$127,000; and the Waldron Lake State Recreational Area, \$300,000. This would then make a total of \$1,316,000 which is very close to the amount that is in the budget that is remaining at the present time. There is a whole page full of Game and Parks Recreational Roads for the five year plan. I will not take time to read them all, but the total tab on that is \$4,536,000. If I can find for you in just a moment, here are the priorities as they have been established. I can't find it right now, but the priorities are established for the designation of the road in the one-year plan and the five-year plan. I close with the statement that I urge you to support the amendment to do the things that are necessary to do.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore, do you have a question?

SENATOR NORE: I would like to ask Senator Burbach a question if he would yield.

PRESIDENT: I'm going to allow the question because you are the introducer of the bill, because he was closing now.

SENATOR NORE: Now this million dollars would be at the expense of our regular highway roads. We would have to take it from that?

SENATOR BURBACH: This is...true, it is in the highway trust funds and anything that you take from that trust funds for a specific project, and these roads are build by the state and they are not necessarily on the state, they are not on the state highway system in most cases. But they are and do provide a service yes.

SENATOR NORE: But they do take away or subtract from our total highway development. That is one regular highways.

PRESIDENT: Senator Maresh, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I wonder if Senator Burbach would yield to a question. Senator Burbach, this specifies access roads, this would not apply to roads inside of a state park would it? What I am asking about is the Alexandria State Lakes, they promised me about two years ago that they would improve the roads inside of the park and I'm trying to find out from the Game Commission, through my Secretary what the status is on this, but so far I haven't found out. Do you know if this is included in the supposed....

SENATOR BURBACH: I think that there was probably or that I was probably in err before someone asked me the question if these were only access, but there are some internal roads.

SENATOR MARESH: Your amendment would specify only access roads, right?
