

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Senator Murphy what is the fund that you are taking this money out of and what did the committee put into this fund, and why is it that you feel that you can take these up to \$75,000 out of this particular fund.

SENATOR MURPHY: Let me answer two questions. Let me start with Senator DeCamp's if I may.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I would prefer that you answer my question rather than Senator DeCamp's.

SENATOR MURPHY: Alright sir, we will answer your question. I asked the fiscal staff to prepare this amendment at my request. I was asked by no one in the band, and no one at the University. I'm happy to say that it was my own idea after watching these young people this summer. Now there is very nearly \$35,000,000 in that revolving fund. I would venture to say that we spill more money than that, the recommendation that comes out of that fund was at the recommendation of the fiscal staff.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Would you oppose merely taking it out of the general fund and leaving that particular fund alone Senator since evidently, the fiscal staff and the budget committee originally thought that fund ought to have a certain amount of money. Would you object to taking it out of the general fund?

SENATOR MURPHY: I would not exceed to it without checking with the fiscal staff Senator. I believe that they are probably the best informed in this matter and it was there recommendation that it come from this fund.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Then perhaps Mr. President, I'd better ask Senator Marvel or somebody from the appropriations committee to answer the question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel, do you care to respond? Senator Luedtke has a question.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Senator Marvel, you probably heard the question. The question is this particular auxiliary fund that Senator Murphy wants to take up to \$75,000 out of. What is this fund consisting of and why did you feel that the amount that you put in there is necessary?

SENATOR MARVEL: I'll try and get you the answer in just a second.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: I would address myself to Senator DeCamp. I don't remember the poet who once said breaths there a man with heart so dead that never onto him has said. I would say that I was solicited by no individual to make this suggestion to the legislature, truly it has been asked for by no one, and I have talked to no one in the band, and no one on the music staff of the University. It just seemed to me that with all of the criticism that we have raised of our young university people, that this is a very apt opportunity to show that we are not totally one sided.
