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that is in operation. I was very highly critical at one time. I no longer criticize it because we need it. The same one in Brownville for example, it is on the position I guess they are now on stream, I guess that it will take a number of months to fully depend after a shakedown as to what it can do. But these things we accept with a great deal of apprehension. This body has the responsibility and the only responsibility to see as far as we can within reasonable cost. That if and when an accident occurs there is someplace for people to go. Now not only in this state but those states that surround us who are not in the same position. That I support Senator Goodrich.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly, Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the legislature, this amendment is mixing up doctors and lawyers and I request that we separate the question and vote on the lawyer business then vote on the doctor business.

PRESIDENT: Well stand by, lets see if the issue can be divided. Senator Goodrich do you care to respond to the question that the request here that possibly we divide the issue.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes, it could be divided into three parts. I would have no objection to it.

PRESIDENT: Alright, see if you can handle it back there would you Senator Goodrich, I don't have the amendment.

SENATOR GOODRICH: OK, the first part, we divide the issue then lets divide, or talk about three different things. One is the paralegal training program and one is \$25,000 for the Lincoln campus. Now the question is do you want to go and provide for the legal training program, the start of one on the Lincoln campus and that is all that that particular amendment provides for. I move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Alright, now we are speaking about that particular section. Now, who wants to speak on that particular issue. Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Yes sir.
