It is certainly a backwards approach and this was determined in six or seven hours worth of conversation last summer in the education committee, and the education committee turned the program down on the basis a of this that those that want this, of which I am one, do not how to go about it at this time and 25,000 or 250,000 would do absolutely no good to get the end result.

PRESIDENT: Are you all through discussing the amendment? Excuse, that portion of the amendment? Senator Dickinson your light is still on, are you through discussing? Senator Keyes, did you want to be heard? Senator Goodrich back to you then.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I would just like to close on this part of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Right, Senator Dick....or a...a...Senator Goodrich is closing on part of the amendment. The first part.

SENATOR GOODRICH: By saying to Senator Kelly for example that just because he doesn't know how to do it, that doesn't mean that Shaneyfelt who is the associate dean of the law college doesn't know how. He does know how. For example there is an American Bar Association program, established curriculum the whole ball of wax is established by the American Bar Association and that is what would be adopted as a course of study for this type of training. I would suggest that Shaneyfelt and the ARTs College do know how to do this. I move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich, does the Chair understand that this is involving \$25,000? Alright...The Chair understands that that involves the \$15,000 and the \$25,000 here and that we are speaking down to the amendment to that point. Now Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: No, no, that is not right. This is then just the \$25,000 first part of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: OK, Paragraph one of the amendment. That is all that is under discussion and that is all that is under vote at this particular time now. Senator Clark he was closing do you have a question? Go ahead.

SENATOR CLARK: Has the question been divided or are we going to....

PRESIDENT: Question has been divided. That is the point that I am trying to make. We are taking the first paragraph down to the \$25,000, paralegal training only. That is all that is under vote, that is all that is under discussion at this time. Got it? So, Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: That is paralegal training at the Lincoln campus only. That is all that it is.

PRESIDENT: Alright, now all those in favor of that amendment
