A division of the question was asked, to make sure that you understand that you are voting on paragraph one on page 1318 of the Goodrich amendment, which is amendment number four. It involves \$25,000. That is all that is under vote at this time. Chair would ask if you have all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 13 ays, and 16 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion is lost. Senator Goodrich back to you. Now the second part of this is a combination of two things. This is the same paralegal training program of \$25,000 at UNO. Also, the \$15,000 miscellaneous expense item for the tuition remission plan at UNO and I would suggest for example that since the UNO campus responded to the inquiry and stated how much exactly that they needed for the start of the program and that there are a good number of legal secretaries in the city of Omaha for example that we would try it out at the UNO campus as an experiment and see what goes. See if it goes alright. See if we can at least establish with some volunteer attorneys that we have a supply of that will teach the program at the UNO campus, and I would plead with you to go ahead and adopt this portion of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Whitney, then Senator Kelly.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Senator Goodrich would you yield to a question please? It was my understanding that the budget committee did put in money for a continuation of the Goodrich plan, is this correct?

SENATOR GOODRICH: That is true.

SENATOR WHITNEY: OK, thank you.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Let me finish answering that. It was based on the, that strictly tuition remission and the faculty salary and frankly they don't have anything to use for miscellaneous expenses of the program. That is what we are asking the \$15,000 for.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Would the miscellaneous program be a trip to Europe or a trip to Washington, D. C. or something like that?

SENATOR GOODRICH: You don't go to Europe, or take a class to Europe for \$15,000 Ramey, they could for example if they were trying to teach these kids government and take them to Washington or something like that but not to Europe.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, I have a question of Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

SENATOR KELLY: What is the Goodrich plan?

SENATOR GOODRICH: The Goodrich plan is a portion of the overall tuition remission plan. It is a plan that has for example a approximately 165 economically deprived kids in college with a full tuition waiver. The plan was adopted now not last year but the year before last and it is working very well. The plan
