As we've done it. And I'm going to try and talk on this issue. And if I'm out of order then wave at me..don't hit me with that mallet. The main concern that I have and I'd like to address to Senator Goodrich, I think that we in my opinion with the law college at the University of Nebraska, we should keep any Para-Legal Program that we have here. Now I have tried to help Omaha the Omaha Medical School, and have asked for a survey and have got some information and would like to increase one of the programs that they have down there. Which is the physical Therapy Program. I would like to make this a bigger program for students to attend. But, I can't get it done. Now if, what you are trying to do is to take the Para-legal students to Omaha, away from the law college, then I think I have every right to start bringing the Physical Therapists to Lincoln away from the Omaha Medical College. I would like to see us get it together and straighten both programs and keep them on their proper campuses.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Can I respond to that.

PRESIDENT: Sure.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well, first of all Wally listen, because we are not taking a thing away from Lincoln. There is no Para-legal Program on either campus. But could we hold this particular discussion, and I've got a solution for your problem, but let's do finish the discussion, since we are on the Goodrich Plan of \$15,000. Let's finish ~~the~~ one first, and then I'll get back to you on the Para-legal, and I'll offer a suggestion as to how we can solve your problem as well as mine.

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, Mr. President, I wouldn't mind doing that. But I'm afraid if I vote for something I may not be able to get out of it. I don't really know where we stand.

SENATOR GOODRICH: There are two separate issues now. We are now discussing the \$15,000 amendment for the Tuition Remission Program at UNO. That's all we are talking about. The Para-legal one will come next. So all I'm asking here is the \$15,000 for miscellaneous expenses in the Goodrich Program at UNO. Now, Senator Marsh, for example, accurately pointed out that the money that is appropriated is for tuition remission, salaries for faculty members and that's it. There's such things as retirement programs, fringe benefit programs for faculty members, but that's all there is. There is no money in the program for miscellaneous expenses..items that they have. And that's why I'm asking for the \$15,000 additional to what was previously..what is already in the budget for it. And that's the way I explained it this morning and that's the way I'd like to explain it again, and that's all in the world it is is a miscellaneous expenses

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item of \$15,000 for them to be able to use to meet some of their miscellaneous things that are not salaries and not tuition.

PRESIDENT: Standby Senator Goodrich, now Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: You mean this is not for tuition or remissions?
