PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: But this is the Goodrich Plan portion of the tuition remission plan. You know the whole bill has about 8 or 9 categories. You know about those. Let me finish now. This is the one of those plans. Within that plan.

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark, Senator Goodrich. We have to transcribe all this and we just can't transcribe when the both of you are talking at once so please try to ask a question and answer it. Now..

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well, I was trying to answer it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich, answer.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well, what I would...let me finish. What we are talking about though, is just the miscellaneous expense items that come up in any of these programs, and this happens to be this particular program, and happens to have some miscellaneous expense items that they need some money for. So I said fine, I will try for \$15,000 for it. It is a very modest sum to give them for operating rooms within that program to meet some of the special problems that they have within that program. And when they are dealing with economically depressed..deprived kids. When they are dealing with economically deprived kids they have special problems, and that's what I'm trying to do, is to cover that for them.

PRESIDENT: Now, Senator Clark

SENATOR CLARK: Now, to me what you are actually doing. We have a \$300,000 as Senator Marsh just stated on the floor, tuition and remissions and now you are asking for \$15,000 more. I think that what the whole program is, right?

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I can't hear the last part of your question. And I'm standing right beside you.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Marsh, and then Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, it's just my loud voice. This isn't on. On? In this budget we have increased this budget \$13,950 over this years budget of \$284,000. We have now upped it up to \$98,000. This is simply asking, for doubling the money we have increased. And when you say \$15,000 out of a nearly \$300,000 budget, that's not very much. It simply is the principle of the thing when this came before the budget we have increased it and he is now asking for additional increases. Which I do not feel are justified, nor should they be brought up now.

PRESIDENT: Now, Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: O.K. I'd like to respond, Shirley Marsh, would you please listen, this is the second time I've said it. You said it yourself. You know what's in the budget for this thing. The tuition remission portion of it. Also the salaries. There is nothing said in there about miscellaneous expense items.
