CLERK: 3 ayes, 21 nays on call of the house.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The motion for a call of the house fails. Read the tally of the original motion. The motion to amend the \$15,000 the first amendment fails. The second amendment.

CLERK: The second amendment is an amendment offered by Senator Goodrich which is not in the Journal, which would simply create or appropriate \$25,000 for the Para-legal training program.

PRESIDENT: Now, Senator Barnett. We are now discussing the Para-legal side of this amendment which is a separate amendment. Did you want to be recognized for that?

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, Mr. President and members of the Legislature I would ask Senator Goodrich a question. I'd like as Terry said, don't argue all day on this. So I hope we don't. What's the solution you have to strengthen the Para-legal program and to also strengthen the physical therapy program. Can we come to an agreement?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well, what I'm going to suggest is this, Senator Barnett. Since we are not strengthening anything. We are just strating the para-legal program. Now, then this morning we rejected the starting of a para-legal program at Lincoln. Right now we are still talking about the starting of a Para-legal program at UNO, and that's all I'm suggesting. All ~~that~~ we are talking about right now. Now, if for example, you wanted it at both campuses, then you could amend my motion to read. The \$25,000 for UNO and reinsert the \$25,000 amendment for UNO to be included in the program.

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, Senator Goodrich, then I'm going to have to oppose it. I'm not going to try to amend it. I'm just going to oppose it because I don't think that we should split the campus, split the program between the Lincoln and Omaha. We have a law college up here, and these people, these Senators turned it down once before. I'd like to talk to you about it during the interim if we could. I think you've got a good idea. I'd like to see it, but I think it should be where the law college is, just like the physical therapy program is where the Omaha Medical Center is. And therefore, I'd have to oppose it on those grounds.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion now of the amendment. All right, Senator Goodrich, you may close on that other separate amendment now. Senator Goodrich is closing.

SENATOR GOODRICH: O.K. What I'm asking for is \$25,000 to start a Para-legal training program at UNO campus. This will be done with volunteer attorneys, as the instructors in the classes. Those classes, for example, such as English, Mathematics, and the regular routine academic courses will be given by the regular
